Access Information

- Access to Camping at the Mote is for Camping at the Mote guests only with their valid wristband obtained on arrival from the Campsite Box Office.
- All Camping at the Mote guests will be required to keep their wristbands with them at all times to gain access to the campsite. You will receive a separate event wristband when you arrive from the Campsite Office, which will provide you with access to the Fair over the weekend. Remember your Camping at the Mote package did not include a ticket to gain entry to the Fair. Please ensure you have your event ticket with you too.
- Please collect your wristbands before you pitch your tent. If you are camping in your Live In Vehicle, please park your vehicle and make your way to the Live In Vehicle Wristband Exchange. If this is shut please go to either the Main Wristband Exchange or the Campsite Box Office (both approx 5 minutes walk away).

When arriving by Car / Motorbike:

Please ensure you have your Car Pass ticket ready to be scanned. These can not be purchased on the day.

- On arriving all Camping at the Mote guests who are driving cars or motorbikes should enter The Mote Cricket Club at the entrance on Willow Way. The address is The Mote Cricket Club, Willow Way, Maidstone, Kent ME15 7RN.

These passes do not allow you to park in our Park & Walk situated at Maidstone Grammar School.



When arriving by Motorhome / Caravan / Campervan:

Please ensure you have your Live In Vehicle Pass ticket ready to be scanned. These tickets can not be purchased on the day.

- Please follow event signage to Live-In Vehicles.
- The address of the entrance is Maidstone Leisure Centre, Off West Park Road, Maidstone, Kent ME15 7RN. Once inside the leisure centre car park, please follow our traffic stewards instructions. In a change from 2016, you will be turning right inside the leisure centre car park, not left.
- Vehicle movements: Due to the location of Camping at the Mote and the Live In Vehicle Field and the anticipated traffic flows around Mote Park vehicle movements are severally restricted on the event days for Health and Safety reasons. We advise that you do not try and leave in your vehicle, as there may be a long wait to return.

When arriving by Foot

- Please enter Mote Park via the Main Entrance, Mote Avenue, ME15 7RN
- Access to Camping at the Mote is past the playground on the right.

General Information

Following on from events of the last couple of months, there will be intensive bag searches taking place on all gates - we advise you to avoid bringing a bag with you unless absolutely necessary, as this will delay your entrance. Please only bring what is necessary. Searches will also be carried out on the gates. Please be patient when entering and re-entering the site and allow plenty of time to get into the festival.

- Our camping is community style meaning there are no fixed pitches. Please respect your camping neighbours, keep your guy lines clear or the fire lines and more importantly, have fun and make friends with like-minded Ramblers!
- Noise: Please respect your fellow campers and local residents by keeping noise to a minimum when walking around the campsite during the night/early hours of the morning.
- The Camping area is fenced in and there will be 24-hour security in the area. Noise patrol stewards will operate after midnight due to the close proximity of some local residences. They will ask politely if the noise levels are too loud.
- Rubbish & Waste: Please place rubbish in bins provided to help make the environment as nice as possible for all Ramblers.
- Drinks and food in the campsite: You are able to bring alcoholic drinks and food into the campsite. Please make sure these are not in glass containers.
- There is no power, water or waste hook ups for Live In Vehicles.
- Camping at the Mote is for Camping at the Mote pass holders only and so unfortunately, your friends will not be able to join you at the campsite or the Cricket Clubhouse bar without a Camping at the Mote wristband. This also applies to the Live In Vehicle field.
- Live In Vehicle field pass holders are welcome into Camping at The Mote to visit The Mote Bar or food unit.

Prohibited Items

- Search Policy: You and your vehicle may be searched at the entrance to the campsite and the Fair for any items that may be used in an illegal or offensive manner. If found they will be confiscated. Do not attempt to bring in illegal substances as you stand a very real chance of being caught.
- Restricted items that cannot be bought into the campsite or arena:
 - Offensive weapons or anything that may be considered to be an offensive weapon.
 - Any glass containers of any kind (e.g. alcohol or ketchup).
 - Alcohol (arena only, it is allowed in the Camping at The Mote & Live In Vehicle Field) and illegal drugs (prescription drugs are acceptable)
 - Fireworks, flares, laser pens or laser equipment
 - Air horns



- Music Sound systems
- With the exception of Assistance Dogs, no animals are allowed on site.
- BBQs

What facilities are there?

Toilets and showers are provided (including disabled toilets and showers in the accessible areas and Live in Vehicle Field). The cricket clubhouse bar will be open and a food outlet is provided.

- Toilets and Showers: There are regularly cleaned toilets and showers in the Camping at the Mote Campsite and the Live In Vehicle field. Please help us by keeping them clean; it will be mutually beneficial. Always wash your hands after using the toilets.
- Food is available from the outlet in Camping at The Mote or the Cricket Clubhouse. Please expect these to shut on show days at around 1pm. People in the Live in Vehicles field have access to the Camping at The Mote Food Outlets. There is no food within the Live In Vehicle Field. There is a large selection of food outlets to cater for all tastes at reasonable price within the arena.
- There is a bar at the Cricket Clubhouse. For timings, see above.
- Cooking & Fires: Open campfires and BBQs are strictly prohibited on site. Cooking is only permitted on portable cooking stoves. If using these, please do so a safe distance away from your tent or glamping unit.
- There is a Campsite Office based at the Campsite Box Office which will be open if you have any questions or need assistance. Once the Campsite Box Office closes, for emergencies, please speak to the Security.
- Valuables: if you don't need it – don't bring it! Carry money, credit cards, mobile phones, cameras, and all other valuables with you at all times! There is a cloakroom within the Main Arena only.
- There is a Sainsbury's on Romney Place, Maidstone, Kent ME15 6SF address. This is one mile away.
- Water: There are standpipes that contain free drinking water in the campsites and the arena.
- The campsite may be dark at night so please bring a torch and take care when walking at night. Please be cautious of trip hazards such as guy lines.

What Happens if I have an Emergency?

- Emergency Services: There is 24 hour medical care on site. If you need any assistance do not call 999 as you will unnecessarily tie up services from a nearby town. There are an ample number of Stewards and Security on site who can be alerted to call upon emergency services or assist as necessary.
- Emergency Exits: Ensure you know where your nearest emergency exits are and follow any instructions given by Stewards or Security.
- If you need to take medication regularly remember to bring it and let your friends know of any illness or allergies you may have.

General Festival Information

- Entry to the Fair is via the Main Entrance: this is "A" on the map. Ramblers in the Live In Vehicle Field will be able to use the Glamping Entrance "B".
- Drinks and food in the arena: as the arena is licensed you are not able to bring alcohol into the area. You can bring a 500ml bottle of water that can be refilled into the arena. There will be plenty of bars on site selling a variety of drinks at reasonable prices. You can bring a small amount of precooked food of the snack variety. Picnic hampers are not allowed.
- Professional Cameras are not allowed inside the arena. This is classed as any camera with an interchangeable lens over 35mm.
- You will be able to leave the festival arena and be readmitted throughout the day. Please note, you may be subject to a search at every readmission.
- The management reserves the right to refuse entry.

Terms & Conditions

- Camping is at your own risk. The promoter or the Maidstone Cricket Club shall not be held liable for loss, injury or damage sustained within the site.
- Please keep to the rules outlined above as failure to do so may result in you being asked to vacate the site.

- The management reserves the right to make any changes whatsoever to the proposed programme/package owing to unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances.
- Any person found behaving in a manner deemed unsociable or potentially dangerous will be ejected without a refund.
